# Message from the President

#### Silvia Yueh

I hope everyone reading the annual report is doing well and finding a sense of normalcy in life. At Sachen Foundation, staying committed to our long-term goals, while navigating the ups and downs of worldly and investment market conditions,

has helped us remain focused and grounded. We are incredibly grateful for the support and stability provided by our recurring donors, as well as the dedication of our selfless board and team members. This support allows us to stay true to our mission of supporting the monastic education of monks and nuns, developing Dharma curricula and educational materials for lay practitioners, and Buddha's preserving teachings through archiving, publishing, and translation.



We have observed a significant shift in how people work, receive teachings, and conduct their daily lives, during and after the pandemic. Technology is advancing rapidly, especially with the development of AI, leading to an abundance of information available at our fingertips. However, the rise of social media and the demand for greater efficiency and productivity in our technology-driven world has resulted in increased mental distractions and stress. A large-scale study conducted by researchers from Harvard Medical School and the University of Queensland shed light on a major global health problem: half of the world's population will experience a mental health disorder in their lifetime. I have witnessed the toll this has taken on the young people I encounter. According to the World Health Organization, there is a global mental health crisis, with about 15% of adolescents experiencing a mental health condition. The National Institute of Health recognizes youth mental health as a priority issue. At Sachen Foundation, we are exploring ways to make our Children's Dharma Curriculum more relevant, providing young people with mind-training tools to navigate the challenges of a rapidly changing environment.

On September 21, 2024, the Sachen Foundation launched its Abhidharma program online. Abhidharma is the first year of the DharmaChakra program, a five-year Buddhist text-based curriculum for lay practitioners. The teachings are being offered by His Holiness the 42nd Sakya Trizin, one of the most renowned and respected masters of Tibetan Buddhism. The extensive teachings of Abhidharma and Buddhist psychology provide a path to a clearer and deeper understanding of the nature of reality, bringing us closer to understanding our minds and freeing ourselves from suffering.



# **Institutional Support**

In 2023, Sachen Foundation awarded \$94,100 in education grants to five monastic institutions—Sakya Centre, Sakya Nunnery, Kalimpong Sakya Monastery, Pema Ts'al Sakya Monastic Institute, and Bajrayogini Meditation Center—399 monks and 123 nuns benefitted from the grants.





The grants played a crucial role in securing the long-term financial stability of these monastic institutions. By providing essential funding, they enabled the institutions to retain qualified, full-time teachers, ensuring a consistent level of education and spiritual guidance for the students. Additionally, the grants supported the organization's day-to-day operations, from administrative tasks to facility maintenance, helping to create a stable and nurturing environment. Perhaps most importantly, the funding contributed to the holistic well-being of the students—both physically and mentally—allowing them to focus fully on their studies and spiritual growth without the distractions of financial or logistical concerns. This comprehensive support system fostered an atmosphere conducive to academic excellence and personal development.



# Education & Publication



To cultivate and inspire the next generation of Buddhists, it is essential to provide children with a strong foundation in basic Buddhist education. The Sachen Foundation plays a pivotal role in this mission by supporting the development of comprehensive children's curricula and lesson plans. These educational resources are designed to be utilized by Buddhist centers, schools, and parents, ensuring that young learners have access to age-appropriate teachings that nurture their understanding of Buddhism's core principles and values. By fostering early engagement, the Foundation helps lay the groundwork for lifelong spiritual growth and practice.

In addition to supporting youth education, the Sachen Foundation is equally committed to advancing the study and practice of Buddhism among lay adult students and practitioners. To further this goal, the Foundation offers scholarships to translators, retreatants, and students pursuing advanced Buddhist studies. These scholarships provide crucial financial assistance to individuals dedicated to deepening their knowledge and practice, whether through translating sacred texts, undertaking long-term retreats, or engaging in scholarly research. Through these initiatives, the Sachen Foundation ensures that the richness of Buddhist teachings continues to thrive across all generations and levels of study.

# Young Adult Buddhist Education

**Barre Center for Buddhist Studies** aims to offer young adults an opportunity to deepen their practice and understanding and, drawing on Buddhist traditions, discern a trajectory for living virtuously and skillfully in a world with many needs.

Every year, the Barre Center for Buddhist Studies has an annual meditation retreat called "Touching the Earth," which provides a rare opportunity for young adults (aged 18-25) to significantly deepen their meditation practice and cultivate a Buddhist orientation to contemporary challenges.

Located on a secluded Vermont farm, this small learning community explores Buddhist understandings of dependent origination for three weeks through the fields of permaculture, ecology, living systems theory, eco-psychology, social justice, and climate studies. Because the program is centered on the bodhisattva ideal of cultivating the self in the service of others, participants develop a sense of how their lives might unfold in a way that encourages wisdom and compassion.



The retreat gives young people an embodied, lived experience of deep meditation, deep connection with others in an open and vulnerable context of saṅgha/spiritual friendship, and a sense that life can be meaningful even, or perhaps precisely because, there is a world in crisis. In this sense, it promotes the Dharma for young people living in a very challenging world.

The Sachen Foundation's 2023 grant allowed Barre Center to accept 14 students regardless of financial means and 3 assistants who had been participants in 2021 or 2022, benefited from leading some activities and supporting the faculty. As such, a more diverse group of young people had the opportunity to engage deeply with Buddhist teachings and practices that speak to the contemporary world. Meanwhile, because this program is so rich, and so deeply beneficial to participants, it also benefits the faculty who enthusiastically bring elements of this holistic and immersive model of practice into other teaching contexts.

# Children's Dharma Education Curriculum

The **Children's Dharma Education Curriculum** by Sachen Foundation was officially launched in 2021. Currently, ninety people have signed up to use the 5-8-year-old curriculum on teachable.com and have been using this program for Children's Dharma

education. The team continues promoting the current 5–8-year-old curriculum and gathers feedback on what has been done.

The next step is to move onto the 9-11 year old Dharma education curriculum. Much of this work has already been completed by Tashi Haig, and we will incorporate feedback into further development.

# Dharmachakra: Dharma Education for Lay Practitioners

Led by Khenpo Rinchen Gyaltsen, the **Dharmachakra** team is planning a 5-year program running from 2024 to 2028, of classical Buddhist texts taught by His Holiness, i.e. *Abhidharma*, *Bodhisattvacharyavatara*, *Madhyamaka*, and *Uttaratantra*. This program will be available online and in person in Spain. His Holiness will teach in English directly and then be translated into other languages and posted online. The first-year Abhidharma online course consists of 22 lessons, and each lesson is in English, Spanish, and Chinese subtitles. The enrollment opened on May 23, 2024, and the course began on September 21, 2024, with one lesson per week.

# Archiving

The Sachen Foundation is proud to support the Sakya Tradition for a fourth consecutive year. Its mission is to archive and preserve the teachings of the Sakya lineage, concentrating on collecting them in audio, video, and written formats in multiple languages, digitizing cassettes and video tapes, and developing a comprehensive online catalog. In 2023, efforts were also made to publicize the e-library and its application, sharing them in pictorial and video formats, as well as a Dharma comic series.

As of February 25, 2024, the e-library has archived 90 teachings in various formats, including audio, video, and text. Of these, 56 have been transcribed, edited, and published in English. Additionally, translations from English have been made into Chinese, Spanish, Romanian, Italian, Portuguese, German, Thai, and French.

This long-term project will focus on increasing their collection of teachings, as well as transcribing, translating, and publishing them as texts in multiple languages. In addition, the project intends to add translated subtitles to the videos that are already in the collection. Find out more at sakyatradition.org.

## The Sachen Archives

Archiving, translating, and publishing the holy Dharma is the Sachen Archive Initiative's lifeblood with a focus on the publication of prayers, practice texts, and commentaries. Our niche contribution towards the preservation and distribution of the Buddhadharma and our unique Sakya-pa tradition is paramount.

By the recitation of prayers, we accumulate merit and generate the aspiration to achieve the excellent qualities of awakening, thereby planting the seeds of future attainment. In order to actualize what we have learned and contemplated, it is essential for us to practice authentic teachings. By studying the commentaries of learned masters the prayers we recite become more clear and profound, and, like a lamp dispels the darkness, similarly,



they clear away doubt, enhance our learning, and improve our practice. This particular void in the current translation, publication, and scholarship of these texts propels us into action.

The Sachen Archives is committed to helping connect practitioners and students with Sakya-affiliated resources and the translated prayers, texts, etc. associated with our lineage. The efforts of the Sachen Archive Initiative are dedicated to preserving and making accessible these precious resources through both traditional and modern mediums.

In 2023, the Sachen Archive Initiative (SAI) rebranded as The Sachen Archives (SAS) to better reflect our growing maturity as an archival and translating house for Sakya texts and resources. Our team continued building upon its multi-year Phase-2 initiative, which entails the commissioning of previous untranslated liturgical texts, paramitayana rituals, etc., associated with the Sakya tradition. During the annual year, we published several original translations. We oversaw the editing of several more, as well as published *A Collection of Prayers for the Health & Longevity of His Holiness*, the 41st Sakya Gongma Trichen Rinpoche, in honor of his auspicious 80th birthday. We have also completed our long-awaited liturgical book, *A Simple & Complete Collection of Liturgical Texts from the Glorious Sakya Tradition*, which we anticipate publishing in 2025. Furthermore, we have lined up several projects that we hope to share with you in the future, along with a newly improved website.

# **Translations**

The Amazing Treasury Translation Project completed the translation of Volume 1 (321 pages of the 667 total) of the 17th-century Tibetan text, The Amazing Precious Treasury Fulfilling all Wishes, by Jamgön Amé Zhab Nakwang Kunga Sönam (1597-1660). This

important text describes major religious and intellectual movements that helped shape not only the Sakya lineage but also Tibetan Buddhism in general. The first volume also includes illustrations of Sakya lineage masters, especially commissioned for this project. These were hand-drawn based on murals at Sakya Monastery and instructions from a rare text provided by HH the Sakya Trichen Rinpoche. The translators presented an early copy of Volume 1 to His Holiness the Sakya Gongma Trichen Rinpoche, during the 2023 Annual North American Sakya Monlam in Toronto. The first volume is now available from Wisdom Publications.

In 2023, Sachen Foundation sponsored the translation of Volume 2 (346 pages out of 667 total), which is scheduled to be completed in 2024 and submitted to Wisdom Publication. We hope the English translation of this profound text will benefit all sentient beings and contribute to the flourishing of the Dharma, particularly the spread of the great Sakya lineage.

# Investment & Financials



Staying on course and committed to the long-term investment goal in chaotic and uncertain times seems to have paid off for Sachen Foundation in 2023. Thanks to the selfless and committed generous donors and team members, we continue our work in supporting Monastic Dharma Education, developing Lay practitioners and Children's Curriculum, and Translating and Archiving to preserve Buddha's teachings and Sakya Tradition.

## Contributions

Sachen Foundation saw a 15% increase in the total number of donors from 16 countries and a stable yet slight decrease in total dollar donations compared to 2022. In addition, the foundation's returning donor rate increased by 6% to 86% of our donors classified as annual recurring. The Foundation is deeply grateful for the consistent generosity, encouragement, and diversity of our donors around the world.

# **Investment Summary**

The main story in 2023 was the reversal of fortunes seen in both the stock and bond markets. After a down year in 2022, we witnessed a roller coaster of a year in 2023, which ended with an incredible rally during the fourth quarter. The year began with recession fears but 2023 shaped up to be a very good year for the U.S. economy. Cooling inflation, a still robust labor market, continued economic growth and a much-awaited pivot in the Federal Reserve's policy on interest rates drove the S&P 500 index to recorded levels in December 2023. Global equity markets increased sharply in 2023, with 22% growth, led by a 26% return on the S&P 500 index. With cooling inflation, investors began anticipating a lower path of future interest rates, resulting in a rally in bonds. The US bond market increased by 5%.

The Foundation's investment portfolio increased from \$2.1 million at the beginning of the year to \$2.4 million at December 31, 2023. The total portfolio's return, net of fees, was 16% in 2023, with an asset allocation of 49% in equities, 47% in fixed income, and 4% in cash. The Foundation's equity portfolio returned 29%, outperforming the S&P 500 index, which returned 26%. Fixed income portfolio returned 7%, outperforming the benchmark US bond index, which had a return of 5%.

The strong rebound in the portfolio in 2023 after a bear market in 2022 demonstrates the power of "staying the course." It showcases how investing in a diversified portfolio and sticking with long-term targeted allocation can help speed recovery. The investment committee continues to pursue this strategy with the help of our investment advisor.

# Financial Review & Grantee Audits

In line with the Board's commitment towards transparency, an independent financial review was conducted by Smith, Schafer & Associates, Ltd for the 2023 fiscal year. Per the reviews, the accountants concluded that they "are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the accompanying financial statements in order for

them to be in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America."

In addition, the grant committee subjected each grantee to an internal audit and review to ensure proper expenditure of the funds received.

The trust of our donors is the cornerstone of the Sachen Foundation's belief in financial transparency and accountability. The work committed behind the scenes ensures the foundation's financial health and integrity. To that end, we will continue honoring our fiduciary responsibility and diligent efforts in ensuring the foundation's financial success.

# Sources of Financial Support

Sachen Foundation operating funds originate from two revenue streams: contributions by donors and investment income. Total contributions and investment income for calendar year 2023 were \$423,935, including \$343,851 from unrealized gain from the investment as of December 31, 2023. Total expenditures, including grants to charities, were \$147,785. Net assets as of December 31, 2023, were \$2,530,088.
